

Parent Volunteer Requirements

Any person wishing to volunteer on a regular, on-going basis, more than thirty minutes a week, will need the following items completed before beginning volunteer services;

- 1. Approved Volunteer Application (pick up application in the school office)
- 2. Proof of negative TB (tuberculosis test) within 60 days
- 3. Fingerprint Clearance (live scan) A district office employee will contact you to receive paperwork.



- Students who read above grade level in the third grade enrolled in college at higher rates than their peers who read at or below grade level. Lesnick, J., Goerge, R.M., & Smithgall, C. (2010).
- In a study of some 4,000 students who were not proficient readers in third grade, Hunter College researcher Donald Hernandez found that one out of six failed to graduate from high school on time—four times the rate for proficient readers (2011).

STUDENT ABSENCES: The state auditor requires documentation of all student absences. Your family can assist us by calling the school (530-347-3411) if your child is ill or unable to attend school early the morning of their absence or the evening before. We have an answering machine on the school phone from 4:00pm until 7:30am. When you leave an attendance message on the answering machine, please leave your child's first and last name, the name of your child's teacher and the reason for absence. You may also email eattendant@evergreenusd.org When your child is absent from school and you do not leave a message on the answering machine or call the school office early in the morning, we will call you to verify your child's absence for that day. Unverified absences are unexcused. If your child has three unexcused absences, leave early, and/or tardies, he/she will be considered truant.

TRANSPORTATION: All transportation changes MUST be in writing to ensure student's safety. You may send a note with your student to bring to the office, fax a note or email the transportation change to eattendant@evergreenusd.org. If you wish to have your student walk from the bus stop, you must fill out a form giving permission for your child to do so. Those forms are available in the Transportation Handbook and the office.

<u>STUDENTS ARRIVAL TIME:</u> School begins at 8:20am. Please make sure that your child DOES NOT arrive at school before 7:45am. This is when our early morning recess begins and we have supervision on our playground. Breakfast is served in the cafeteria at 8:00am. If your child arrives after 8:20am, they must come to the office to get an admit slip before they go to class or they may be marked absent for the day.

STUDENT PICK UP TIME: It is important you pick your student up promptly when school is dismissed. When/if emergencies happen and you will be late please notify the office immediately.

SCHOOL MEALS: All meals will be FREE to students this year. A new income form must be completed every school year. If you wish to add funds to your students account, please visit **lingconnect.com** to set up an account.
